

Alcy Torres, MD, FAAP, FAAN, FAES

Dr. Alcy Torres is an Assistant Professor in Pediatrics and Neurology at Boston University and the Director of the Pediatric Concussion Program at Boston Medical Center. He obtained his medical degree from the Universidad Central del Ecuador, with postgraduate studies in Pediatrics and Neonatology at Carlos Andrade Marin Hospital in Quito and Miami Children's Hospital. He then completed an additional residency in pediatric neurology at Boston Children's Hospital, Harvard University where he was first in the class.

He has been selected several times as one of the top child neurologists in the city by Boston Magazine; And the country. He has received numerous teaching awards. He is certified not only in Pediatrics but also in Neurology and Psychiatry with special qualification in Child Neurology.

In addition, he has pioneered the first bilingual program in pediatric neurology in the US to serve the Hispanic community. In 2004 he cofounded a nonprofit organization AENI to assist The children in need in Ecuador and volunteers regularly to provide medical services and education in several MLICs.

He is a fellow of the AAP, AAN, CNS, AES within multiple societies and is a member of the Editorial Board of the Journal of Pediatric Neurology, Journal of Child Neurology and many more. He has published more than 65 peer reviewed articles. His main areas of research are Pediatric Concussion, the genetic origins of the psychiatric illness and the treatment of Epilepsy in patients with ADHD.
